Luke 7: 11 – 17

Soon afterward, Jesus went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd went along with him. ¹² As he approached the town gate, a dead person was being carried out—the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the town was with her. ¹³ When the Lord saw her, his heart went out to her and he said, “Don’t cry.”

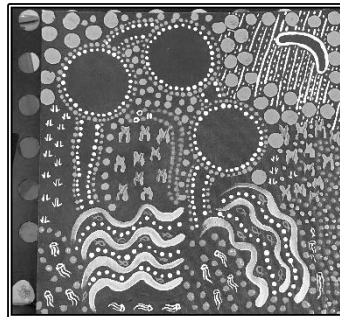
COMMUNITY INTEREST FORUM

Last Monday we had a fascinating evening learning about the culture, customs and artwork of the local Murramarang aboriginal people. Presenters were Jayden Perry, Tracey Turner and our own Kathleen Heath, who revealed herself to be a beautiful speaker of the language and a talented artist. Jayden is a sixth generation descendant of the last Murramarang woman. He displayed some traditional weapons and tools and explained their uses. One example was that a traditional coolamon with possum skin insert was shaped for carrying a baby whilst the mother went about her daily duties.

The Land Council administers a large set of land parcels which are in indigenous ownership. Cultural burn offs are done regularly in such a way as to both reduce vegetation and also avoid intensity which destroys wildlife; people are welcome to come and watch them and discuss the process.

Kathleen not only read one of her books in the local language but explained the symbolism of indigenous artwork.

The community interest forums are organised by Phillip Hellmann to serve the community by providing relevant and helpful information on current matters.

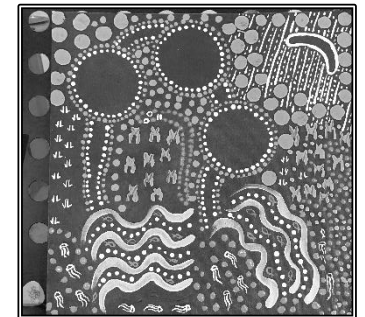
